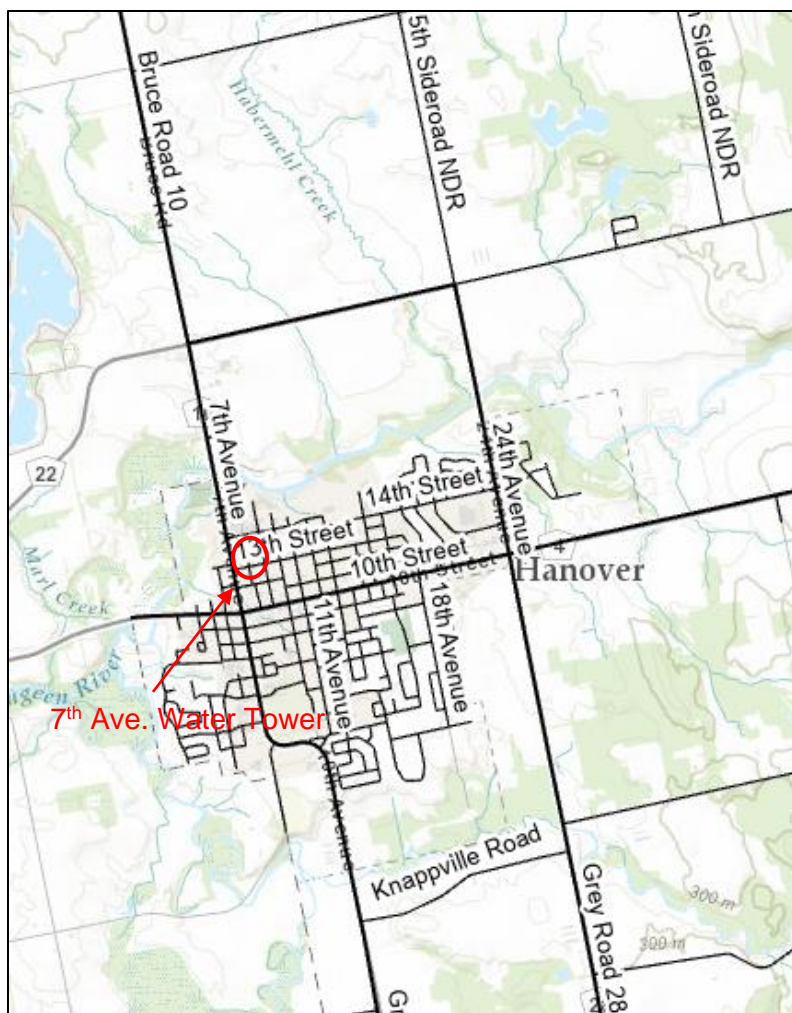
Project Background

In 2021, the Town of Hanover (Town) completed a municipal service needs assessment for the Town's Special Policy Areas (SPAs) within the current municipal boundary. The assessment confirmed the need to replace the 65-year-old 7th Avenue water tower with one of a larger capacity. Water storage for the Town is currently provided by the 7th Avenue and 14th Street water towers. Growth and development is planned for the Town; as such, it is important to ensure that the new water tower has the ability to service the new growth within the Town's SPAs. A new water tower will provide increased access to potable water to the existing residents and ensure sufficient pressure and fire flow at all times. The Town has retained the services of Ainley Group to complete a Schedule 'B' Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) to identify water tower replacement alternatives, including location, to ensure the new water tower has the ability to service the Town's new growth while improving the Town's security of water supply.

The existing 7th Avenue water tower is located at the south end of Town near the Hanover and District Hospital.
