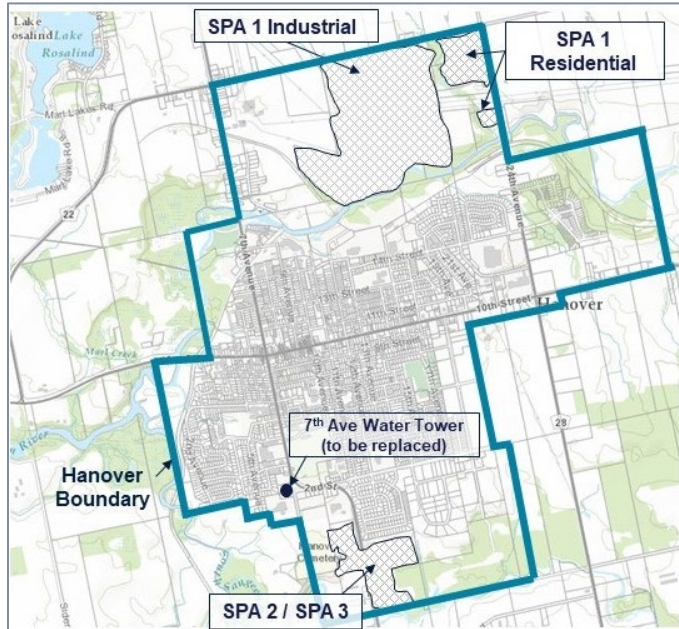


Town of Hanover
7th Avenue Water Tower Replacement
Municipal Class Environmental Assessment
NOTICE OF COMPLETION

The Town of Hanover (Town) has completed a Class Environmental Assessment to identify alternatives for replacing the 67-year-old 7th Avenue water tower to ensure the Town can service new growth within the current boundaries of Hanover while also improving the Town's security of water supply.



The Town has planned this project through a Schedule 'B' process of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (2023). As such, public and technical agency consultation played a role in developing the recommendations.

A Project File Report documenting the planning process undertaken, details of the study recommendations as well as potential impacts and mitigating measures, has been completed and is being made available for public review. Subject to comments received following this Notice and the receipt of approvals, the Town intends to proceed with design and construction of the recommended project, as outlined in the Project File Report.
